Make It Practical: Selfishness vs Humility

- Selfishness is rooted in sin. Read (Galatians 5:17/James 4:2)
- Selfishness forgets God. Read (James 4:3-4/Psalm 37:4)
- <u>Selfishness is infatuated with the world.</u> Read (Exodus 20:3/James 4:5)
- <u>Selfishness fights with people.</u> Read (James 4:1-2/James 4:6)
- <u>Humility releases grace.</u> Read (James 4:7)
- <u>Humility resists the devil.</u> Read (James 4:8-9)
- <u>Humility runs to Jesus.</u>

Talk About It

- What part of this message impacted you the most?
- What things in your life are trying to squeeze out the authority of God?
- What can you do to focus the authority of your life under God, rather than the world?

Our spiritual authority is connected to our spiritual humility.
