Leader Conversation Guide – Revival (Part II)

Main Idea

This week Pastor Curt continued our Revival series. Acts 12:5-17 tells the story of when Peter was imprisoned and the church gathered to "earnestly pray" for his deliverance. God heard the church's cry, and an angel was sent to free Peter from his captivity. We learn from this story the importance of corporate and unified prayer. As the body of Christ, we have a direct line through prayer to petition the work of the Father to be done on Earth. Prayer is our strongest weapon for both attacks against and defense against the enemy.

Make It Practical

- <u>When the church prays, miracles happen.</u> There is power in prayer. Acts 12:5, shows even in the most dangerous circumstances, God hears the cry of His church.
- <u>When the church prays, we come into agreement with God.</u> We read in 1 John 5:14-15 that, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him."
- <u>When the church prays, God always does more than we can ask.</u> Ephesians 3:20 says, "Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us."
