Leader Conversation Guide – The Bible Isn't Boring: Part II

Main Idea

Have you ever wondered if the Bible is just a collection of stories or a book filled with outdated rules? Maybe you've questioned whether it's truly reliable or relevant to your life. Here's the reality—the Bible isn't boring, irrelevant, or just another old book. It's God's inspired Word, filled with truth and power. It was written by eyewitnesses, carefully recorded and preserved, and confirmed by history, archaeology, and prophecy. The Bible is unlike any other book. It claims to be God's very words, speaking life and hope into our hearts. It has the power to transform, guide, and equip us for every good work. What's even more amazing is that the Scriptures are unified—telling one consistent story that points to Jesus from beginning to end. God's Word isn't just something to read; it's meant to shape how we live. The question is: What will be the final authority in your life—the Word or the world?

Make It Practical: What's the Bible all about?

The Bible is the Inspired Word of God

- The Bible isn't just a human creation—it's God's Word revealed to us. (2 Timothy 3:16)

The Bible is Trustworthy

- It was written by eyewitnesses, carefully recorded and preserved, confirmed by history and archaeology, and filled with fulfilled prophecies. (2 Peter 1:21)

The Bible is Unified in Thought

- Despite being written over 1,600 years by 40 different contributors, it tells one consistent story that points to Jesus. (Luke 24:27)

The Bible Has Transforming Power

- God's Word has the power to change our hearts, guide our steps, and give us freedom and truth. (John 8:31-32)

We Must Decide: What Will Be the Final Authority in Our Lives?

- Will it be God's Word or the world's opinions? The choice we make will determine how we live and who we trust. (John 8:31-32)

Talk About It

Why do you believe the Bible is trustworthy?

- Consider how the Bible was written by eyewitnesses, confirmed by history, and fulfilled through prophecy.
- 2 Peter 1:21 – “For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.”

How has God’s Word shaped your life or guided your decisions?

- Think about a time when a passage of Scripture encouraged you, corrected you, or gave you direction.
- 2 Timothy 3:16 – “All Scripture is given by God and is profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.”

What does it mean for the Bible to be your final authority?

- How can we hold to God’s truth when the world offers so many competing voices?
- John 8:31-32 – “Jesus said, ‘If you hold to My teaching, you are really My disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.’”

There’s no world view worth following unless it fixes something in your life.
