Leader Conversation Guide: My Church - Difference Makers

Main Idea

Every person desires to live a life that matters, but true fulfillment isn't found in chasing after temporary success—it's found in knowing God, discovering His purpose for our lives, and making an eternal difference. Scripture reminds us that God has designed us to live with meaning and mission. Jesus said that we are called to bear fruit that brings glory to the Father and joy to our lives (John 15:8,11).

This week's message reminded us that our ultimate purpose is not just to live for ourselves, but to share the Good News and impact the lives of others for eternity. Whether it's in our homes, with our neighbors, across cultural lines, or even to the ends of the earth, God has called us to be difference makers. When we step into that calling, our lives take on a significance that nothing else can match.

As we begin our discussion, let's open our hearts to the Spirit's leading and lean into this truth: ultimate fulfillment is found in being part of God's family and living on mission to make a difference for eternity.

I don't care about my own life. The most important thing is that I complete my mission, the work that the Lord Jesus gave me—to tell people the Good News about God's grace.

ACTS 20:24

Make it Practical:

- Know God, Find Freedom, Discover Purpose, Make a Difference – God designed us to live with meaning and mission. True fulfillment comes when we know Him personally, walk in freedom, and step into His calling for our lives. (Ephesians 1:16–18; John 8:36; Galatians 6:4)
- My ultimate purpose is to make a difference for eternity – Jesus sends us on mission just as the Father sent Him, calling us to bear fruit that brings glory to God and joy to our lives. (John 15:8,11; John 17:18)
- God calls us to make a difference in our world, beyond our world, and to the whole world – From our families and neighbors, to those different from us, and even to the ends of the earth, every believer is sent to share the Good News of Jesus. (Acts 1:8; Mark 5:19; 1 Corinthians 9:22; Mark 16:15)
