## Leader Conversation Guide – Generous: There'll Always Be Enough for You

### Main Idea

Sometimes the greatest miracles begin with the smallest acts of obedience. In 1 Kings 17, a widow in Zarephath found herself at the end of her resources. Out of food, out of hope, and ready to give up. Yet, in that moment of desperation, God was already at work. Through Elijah, He invited her to trust Him with what little she had. And when she said “yes,” God provided more than enough. The flour never ran out. The oil never ran dry.

This week’s message reminded us that God’s provision is not limited by our circumstances—it’s released through our obedience. When we take a step of faith, even when it doesn’t make sense, God meets us there. He multiplies what we surrender and turns scarcity into sufficiency.

As we begin our discussion, let’s open our hearts to the God who still provides, still multiplies, and still proves faithful when we trust Him. When we say “yes,” He provides the rest.

**For this is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says: There will always be flour and olive oil left in your containers until the time when the Lord sends rain and the crops grow again!**

I KINGS 17:14

### Make it Practical:

God’s provision often begins with a step of obedience.

- When Elijah asked the widow to give what little she had, she chose faith over fear. Her “yes” opened the door for God’s miracle.
- 1 Kings 17:13–14

When we trust God with what we have, He proves faithful with what we need.

- The widow’s jar never ran empty. God’s supply didn’t depend on her resources, but on His promise.
- 1 Kings 17:15–16

Every promise of God finds its “Yes” in Christ.

- Just as God fulfilled His word through Elijah, we can trust that in Jesus every promise is complete and secure.
- 2 Corinthians 1:20

## Talk About It

- The widow in 1 Kings 17 was asked to give in the middle of her lack. Why do you think God often invites us to act in faith before we see His provision? Can you share a time when obedience opened the door for God to move in your life?
- Elijah's words, "Don't be afraid," came before the miracle. What fears or doubts most often hold you back from trusting God fully, and how can His promises help you overcome them?
- 2 Corinthians 1:20 reminds us that all of God's promises are fulfilled in Christ. How does knowing Jesus as God's ultimate "Yes" change the way you view your needs, your resources, and your response to Him?

**When you say "yes" to God, He provides the rest. Our obedience invites His provision, and our trust makes room for His miracle.**

## Prayer

Father, thank You for reminding us that Your provision never runs out. Help us to trust You completely, even when we don't see how things will work out. Give us the courage to say "yes" in faith, believing that You will provide everything we need. Strengthen our hearts to walk in obedience, and let our lives reflect Your goodness and faithfulness to those around us. In Jesus' name, amen.

## Next Steps

- Trust God with what you have. Instead of focusing on what's missing, choose to surrender what's in your hands and believe that God can multiply it.
- Say "yes" in faith. Take a step of obedience this week. Whether it's giving, serving, or forgiving. Watch how God meets you in that step.
- Remember God's past provision. Write down times when God has come through for you before, and let those reminders build your faith for what you're facing now.
