Leader Conversation Guide – Pass the Mic: Do You See this Woman?

Main Idea

Luke 7 presents a powerful contrast between two people sitting in the same room with Jesus. Simon the Pharisee believed he had little need for grace, while the sinful woman approached Jesus fully aware of her brokenness. One protected his reputation; the other surrendered everything in worship.

Jesus' question, "Do you see this woman?" is really an invitation to examine our own hearts. When we understand the depth of God's forgiveness, our lives become marked by gratitude, worship, and love for others. This week's message reminds us that the gospel changes not only how we see ourselves, but also how we see Jesus and every person around us.

**Then he turned toward the woman and

Make it Practical:

Recognize your need for God's forgiveness.

- Humility begins when we honestly see ourselves apart from God's grace.
- Luke 7:41-43; Romans 3:23

See Jesus as your greatest need.

- A forgiven heart responds with worship, gratitude, and surrender.
- Luke 7:44-50

Love others from a place of forgiveness.

- When we've experienced God's mercy, we become people who extend compassion and grace to others.
- Luke 7:47-50; Ephesians 4:32

Talk About It

Simon and the woman both encountered Jesus, but they responded very differently. What shaped each person's response, and what can we learn from their example?

Why is it often easier to notice the faults of others than to recognize our own need for God's grace? How can we guard against becoming like Simon?

What are some practical ways we can demonstrate God's forgiveness and love toward people in our everyday relationships this week?

You cannot truly see Jesus or others until you first see yourself as someone who desperately needs His forgiveness.

Prayer

Father, thank You for the incredible gift of forgiveness through Jesus. Help us never lose sight of how much grace You have shown us. Give us humble hearts that worship You, compassionate eyes that truly see people, and lives that reflect the love we've received. May we live each day as people who know they have been forgiven. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Next Steps

Spend time this week thanking Jesus specifically for the forgiveness He has given you.

Ask God to reveal one area where pride or self-righteousness may be keeping you from seeing others with compassion.

Intentionally show grace, kindness, or forgiveness to someone this week as a reflection of what Christ has done for you.
